Tour Handbook

November 25-29, 2022

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PREPARATION

Please pack carefully. You are only allowed one piece of “checked” luggage. You will only be in Hollywood for one week, so don’t take a lot of clothes and personal belongings that you will have to manage. Remember, everything you take PLUS everything you purchase while you are there must go back in that suitcase for your return trip. You will have to carry your suitcase in the airport, load it on a coach, and potentially carry it upstairs in the hotel, so be sure to take something you can handle **BY YOURSELF**. Your suitcase must not weigh more than **50** pounds when it is fully packed and its dimensions, when added together (height, length and width), must not exceed **62** inches.

In addition to your suitcase you are allowed one piece of carry-on luggage and one personal item. In your carry-on bag, you should pack everything that you will need for a twenty-four-hour period. As well as your essential traveling materials (money, identification, prescription medication in original container, etc.) which you **MUST** carry, you may want to bring things to read and a few personal items that will help you to freshen up (toothbrush, etc.). While it is not necessary to bring any food or drink, it’s sometimes handy to carry a small snack in your carry-on bag. Your carry-on luggage can be no larger than 22x14x9 inches. The airlines have very strict rules about the size of carry-on luggage and it must easily fit under the seat in front of you. Remember that you will need room to pack any souvenirs that you buy in Hollywood for the trip home, so don’t over pack on the flight out. You will be outside and walking a **LOT!** Wear comfortable shoes and socks. Hollywood weather can be unpredictable and we don’t alter our schedule because of rain. Typical weather is highs in the upper 60’s and lows in the 40’s especially at night. Plan to dress in layers, wearing more or less as the weather dictates. Expect to have an approximate three-hour plus wait at the parade staging area. We will arrive at about 3:00p in the “heat” of the day and will not step off until 7:00p. It might be rainy so we will have our rain gear with us.

Try to be well-rested before the trip, which can be difficult in the rush of the holiday season. You will enjoy the trip and each other more if you begin this journey feeling relaxed and rested. Be considerate of those around you.

On trips such as this, there is generally a lot of standing in lines. Try to relax, because the process simply **CAN’T** be hurried. We will take two flights to Hollywood. The first leg, will take us to a hub (a larger airport) to board a bigger plane to take us to LAX, a really **LARGE** airport. The reverse will be the case for our return trip. Most flights will be completely full - patience, tolerance, and good manners are the most important things you can “pack” for your journey. In the unlikely event of significant delays the directors will be in contact with the travel offices to resolve the issue as quickly as possible. Patience is the key. Parents and students, please do not bother the flight attendants, let the directors be our voice. We will keep everyone informed.

- Extra glasses or contact lenses, saline solution

DEPARTURE FROM KCI

Chaperones need to arrive at KCI at least 1 hour 45 minutes before flight time. Students must arrive 1 hour and 30 minutes in advance. United Airlines are in Terminal C.

- **United Airlines** Flight 581 leaves at 7:20A.M. from concourse C.
- **United Airlines** Flight 1522 leaves at 7:46A.M. from concourse C.

Find your chaperone as soon as you arrive. When your entire flight group is ready, please proceed with Mr. Hupe or Dr. Thomas to the appropriate gate agent to check your suitcase and receive your ticket for both flights as well as your luggage claim ticket. Put your luggage claim ticket in a safe place. You will proceed with your chaperone to you gate and waiting area. When it is time to board your flight, you will board with your chaperone group.

Bring another picture identification in addition to your KS driver's license or permit (West student ID). You may be asked several simple questions about your luggage requiring yes/no answers. **DO NOT JOKE WITH THE AIRLINE OFFICIALS!** Anything you say in jest regarding a gun or bomb will be taken seriously, and you will be questioned by the police and perhaps removed from the flight. The questioning prior to your flight out of Los Angeles may be even more thorough than what you experience in KC. Your security screening will go much more quickly and smoothly if you do the following things:

Do not pack any sharp objects, lighters or matches in your carry-on luggage. See the following website for detailed information on allowed items and for travel tips to ease the screening process: www.tsa.gov

- Be sure that all liquids and gels are in containers no larger than 3 ounces and that all of those containers are in a single sealed one-quart bag. (3-1-1 rule)
- Passengers should be prepared and security-ready to make the process flow more quickly. Have important travel documents out, coats and jackets off, and carry-on items ready for inspection prior to reaching the security checkpoint.
- Remove jewelry before going through the screening process. Watches, necklaces and even some earrings will trigger metal detectors – they are very sensitive. Store your belt in your carry-on bag until you clear security
- Remove your shoes for inspection during the screening process
- Be sure you have enough battery power to turn on electronic equipment for security screeners or it may be confiscated
- Be polite and answer all questions clearly and follow all requests willingly. It is inevitable that some members of our party will be singled out for additional security screening on a random basis. Full cooperation will make this process go more smoothly
- To minimize the risk of damage or loss, don't pack fragile or valuable items in checked luggage. Take them in your carry-on baggage or ship them.
- Remember to put identification tags in and on all baggage, including carry-on. Put the name and address of the hotel inside your bags.
- Everyone, even frequent fliers, should double check the contents of pockets and bags, particularly carry-on luggage, to ensure no prohibited items are inadvertently packed.
- Don't over-pack bags. If security officers have to open them, closing overstuffed bags can be difficult and may result in that checked bag being delayed to a later flight.

- If TSA security officers need to open a locked bag for inspection, they may have to break the lock. If you choose to lock your bag, we recommend using a TSA-approved lock, which has a locking system that enables security officers to open and relock the bag.

The seating assignments on your boarding passes will probably be assigned alphabetically and security measures may not allow you to trade seats.

At the end of the first flight, you will need to change planes and move to a different gate, probably in a different part of the airport. You will not see your checked luggage, but it will be moved to the new plane for you.

The second flight will be on a plane that is much bigger and more comfortable than the first flight. There will be blankets, pillows, food and drink, movies, TV, and radio. There is sometimes a charge for headphones, but you can usually use the ones you have for your own audio equipment.

When we arrive in Los Angeles, we will retrieve our luggage and board two busses and immediately begin sight-seeing. We will not go to our hotel until after dinner on the first night. It will be a very long day. The best advice I have for you is to try and sleep on the flights so you are ready to go, go, go!

ARRIVAL IN LOS ANGELES

Upon arrival in Los Angeles, you will disembark from your plane. We will make our way to the baggage claim area. Stay with your chaperone group and listen and follow directions carefully. DO not stop to go to the restroom or get a drink, etc. It will be a large airport and you can easily get separated.

- **BAGGAGE CLAIM:** You may need your baggage claim ticket to match up your suitcase. There might be a hundred black suitcases that all look alike! After we gather all of our luggage we will go through the gates to exit. We **MUST** go through together and we must have **EVERYTHING**. They will **NOT** let us go back if we forget anything!!! Please cooperate with flight leaders and chaperones in their requests for help with this task. **EVERYONE** will be needed to help with this task. It works best to have a few people pull every bag with a **West luggage tag** and then find yours from the pile.
- **LUGGAGE INSPECTION:** You must check your luggage to make sure it made the trip without problems. If there is a problem or damage, please notify a director **PRIOR** to leaving the baggage claim area!

Once the entire flight group has moved through the Baggage Claim area, you will board coaches and go to our first adventure. As we wait for our coaches, please keep aisles clear for other travelers.

Our return flights from Los Angeles will be under similar circumstances. On the first stop you will have to change planes but will **NOT** have to pick up your luggage. It will be transferred for you to the next flight to Kansas City where you will pick it up at the Baggage Claim in the Kansas City airport.

HOTEL

Our hotel is the **Holiday Inn and Suites, 1240 S. Walnut Street, Anaheim, CA 92802**

Don't leave valuables in your room when you are not there – not money, cameras, etc.

Students should not charge anything (food, drinks, videos, etc.) to their room. Prices in the restaurants and coffee shops will be high, but there are snack shops on the street nearby. Remember any movement outside the hotel **MUST** be approved and accompanied by **YOUR** chaperone – **NEVER ALONE! This is for your safety.** You are in one of the world's largest cities – You're NOT in Kansas anymore Toto. While most of the locals are very kind and caring, there are "crazies" all around.

Please keep your rooms neat. Chaperones may enter your room at any time. Invite them into your room when they knock. Maid service might be provided daily (making the bed, clean towels, etc.) as long as the room is neat. If the maid finds the room in an unacceptable condition, it will be reported to our resource person so the situation can be corrected.

Our band is a very classy organization. Make sure your behavior is appropriate at all times. Pick up after yourself, use "please" and "thank you," avoid loud, boisterous behavior and vulgar language. Our band will not be the only guests staying in this hotel and we need to be good neighbors to the other guests. Please don't run in the halls or play games in the elevator.

Each day will begin with breakfast. Even if you are not normally a breakfast eater, it is important that you eat a little something. With the different schedule, different foods and lots of walking it is not uncommon for people to get sick and miss out on a lot of enjoyable sightseeing. Each day will conclude with curfew, a bed check by chaperones and lights out. **You are to stay in your room all night. The halls will be monitored.** Chaperones, once the students are in their rooms, we will have a meeting, except for those on night hall duty, to discuss the next day's activities, address any concerns, or pass along helpful tips. It is your responsibility to communicate with your students during bed checks at night or in the morning at breakfast. They will want to know what is planned, so the evening is best if possible.

There will be some free time in the hotel. The pool is off limits for SM West travelers. There are gathering areas around the hotel where you may assemble to visit or play quiet games with friends. Do NOT sit in the halls on the floor to talk, play games or otherwise "hang out." **You may not leave the hotel without a chaperone.**

SICKNESS

Students - If you are feeling ill, you are to first contact your chaperone. If they are unsure of what to do, they will contact Dr. Thomas, Mr. Hupe or Coach Thomas. If it is deemed necessary to seek additional medical assistance, your parents will be called as soon as possible to be included in determining the proper care.

MONEY

Your money is your responsibility. You may wish to consider using something like the American Express Prepaid Card or other VISA Check/Debit card. Funds are loaded onto the card and it can be used throughout the trip to make purchases and withdrawals from an ATM (ATM charges apply).

If you get a new debit/credit card for the trip, be sure to test it here before you leave. In addition, it is a good idea to notify your credit card company or bank of the dates you will be traveling and using your credit/bank card outside the area so they don't suspect that it has been stolen and block purchases.

It is a good idea to determine what banking networks you can use without fees prior to traveling. You can call and ask your bank or possibly look it up on your bank's website prior to travel.

You will need money for lunch each day, snacks, souvenirs. Water and milk are provided at the meals in our hotel, but if you want a soft drink, you will be responsible for the additional charge. Your money is your business, but it is strongly recommended that each family develop a plan with budgets and limits. Don't forget to have some money with you for snacks and beverages in the airports.

CHAPERONE GROUP SIGHTSEEING

Be flexible and patient. It is important that you are responsible to your chaperone. When a meeting time and place are established, be there on time for the benefit of your chaperone and your chaperone group.

Los Angeles will be crowded, especially at Disney and Universal Studios. When allowed to roam freely in the theme parks, your chaperone will set various meeting times to meet face-to-face to check on everyone. Make sure you have cell phone numbers of everyone in your group so you can contact each other in case of emergency. All students should have the name and location of our hotel and the phone number with them at all times, so that in the very unlikely event they are separated from the group they can get back to the hotel.

There are pickpockets in the city and in the theme parks. Keep your money secure (front pant pocket or fanny pack, or small purse under your shirt or jacket), mind your own business, and you will be okay.

You must **ALWAYS** have a chaperone with you **IF** you leave the hotel.

PARADE DAY

The parade begins at 7:00 P.M. We will report to the staging area around 3:00 P.M., so you need to be prepared to wait for up to four hours. Dress for cool and rainy weather. We will eat dinner after the parade. Make sure you have a snack with you while we wait for the parade to begin.

LARGE GROUP TOURS

There are two ‘tour days.’ This will be at the beach, the Hollywood Walk of Fame and the Griffith Observatory. On these days, we will be transported by coach on tour excursions. At each trip destination, the coaches will stop, and there will be time to enjoy sightseeing with friends in smaller groups at the venue. You are not required to be with chaperones at this time (about the only time during the trip), but you will be asked to stay in groups of four or more. Lunches and souvenirs will be available for purchase at your expense, but your admission fees are included on these tour days. Everyone has an assigned coach. The list can be found later in this handbook.

STAFF/CHAPERONES

All of the adults on this trip have made the commitment to help you have the time of your life. They deserve your respect. You will earn their respect by being kind, being on time, and being flexible. Chaperones are to take roll **everywhere** we go. Help them by finding them and letting them know you are present for meetings, or whatever the circumstance. How much fun you have in Los Angeles can depend greatly on your relationship with your chaperone. We all know that SMW band students are the best there are. Make sure your chaperone sees that side of you, because you know that we also have the best parents anywhere! Call your chaperones “Mr.,” “Ms.,” and “Mrs.,” unless asked to do otherwise.

RULES

It is extremely important that students and parents understand the following rules for this trip. All rules apply and will be enforced. The consequence for breaking any of the following rules is severe: the student will be sent home on the first available flight, at the expense of the student’s family. Students and parents are required to sign a sheet acknowledging their understanding and intent to comply with the rules. Your cooperation is appreciated.

1. The Shawnee Mission School District policy regarding use/possession/distribution of drugs, alcohol and tobacco will be strictly enforced:
“Possession, consumption, sale or transfer of alcoholic or cereal malt beverages, tobacco products and restricted substances (drugs) is expressly prohibited.”
2. At no time, and under no circumstances, are students allowed to be in the hotel rooms of students of the opposite sex.
3. A chaperone must always know where you are.

THINGS TO KNOW, SAY AND DO

Pickpockets are good. If you have your purse over your shoulder, they can cut it with a knife and are gone before you know it. Carry your wallet in your front pocket and your purse in front of you or under a jacket. Pay attention to what you are doing and what is going on around you.

Bath towels, hand towels, and wash cloths are provided. Sometimes so are hair dryers.

Street vendors and street markets will have merchandise for less money than shops in buildings, but sometimes the quality isn't as good. Check your goods carefully.

You might want a water bottle, so you won't have to buy drinks all day. Don't take a designer bottle with you. Just get a plastic bottle and refill it while on the trip.

Take a travel alarm clock or set your phone alarm. You will need to be on time for morning meetings and breakfast.

Look for the "souvenir only" line at the Hard Rock Cafe. The line will be shorter.

Take your SMW student ID. It might get you a discount somewhere. Leave your SMW letter jackets at home – it would just identify you as a tourist!

MEALS

Breakfast and one other meal are provided every day. It may be food you are not used to. You have two options: eat it or don't. Complaining is not an option. Breakfast will be a continental breakfast served at a time scheduled to be convenient for our itinerary that day. Depending on the schedule, there may not be a good time to stop and get a snack later, and breakfast is already paid for. Tank up. 😊

TELEPHONE

You may not make outgoing calls from your hotel rooms. You may call room to room and receive incoming calls. Remember Los Angeles time is two hours **BEHIND** Kansas City time. Don't wake your parents up in the middle of the night. If it is 10:00p in Los Angeles, it is midnight in Kansas City.

The emergency phone number is 911 from any phone.
